So, they did what they could: they sought wisdom from the apostles and elders and they prayed for God's guidance. The answer was simple, we are saved not by what we do or say, but only by the grace of Jesus. How we can learn from this? As you prepare this morning, reflect on how God's grace has enabled you and ask again for the grace you need, when you need it.
