At the halfway mark for the year, the church's financials are in good shape. (As shown by the financial statement data and graphic representation below.)

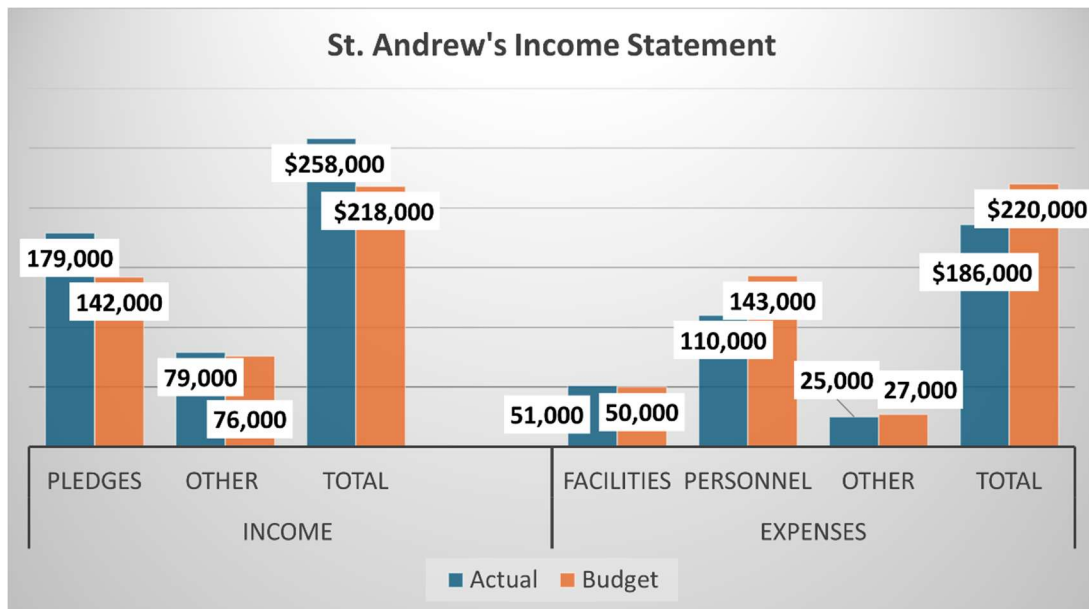

Since many members give their full pledges for the year during the first half of the calendar year, pledges have been more than halfway completed at this time. Expenses are below budget largely because the budget included a full-time Pastor's compensation. Following Pastor Sarah's departure in February, Pastor Amy worked half time (really more) and did not receive the full benefits package that a full-time Pastor receives. Until we bring on a Transitional Pastor, we will continue to underspend in this area when compared with what was budgeted.

We are taking advantage of this surplus and funds from our Foundation to improve our building and expand our mission work. We spent \$14,000 on capital building projects and another \$14,000 for mission in dedicated funds (these figures do not show up in our operational statements). Session also approved using \$5,000 from the Foundation to increase our mission work in support of our sister church in Cuba, supporting the Presbyterian efforts dealing with the earthquake in Venezuela, and helping local mission needs.

PREPARING FOR YOUR NEXT EVENT

St. A's is a busy place throughout the week! At any given time, we have folks here for our own fellowship and ministry groups, support groups like Alcoholics Anonymous, troops representing Scouting America, musical performance group rehearsals, as well as small gatherings on weekends (e.g., recitals, community celebrations, etc.). And we also share our worship spaces with the congregation of New Church of Oregon.

Kara coordinates the schedule for all building users and places all activities, including times and locations, on our church calendar. You can access this at any time to see what's happening here at St. A's. This is particularly helpful when planning

setup for your own events (if arrangements have not been made prior with Kara). Simply click on the calendar button next to the first heading on our Events page to access this calendar.

ST. ANDREW'S NAME TAGS

We've created all new name tags for everyone! Stop by the tower by the sanctuary doors in the narthex and grab your new name tag and wear it during worship. (Don't forget to return it there after service so you'll have it next week too!) If you don't see yours, ask one of our welcome team members if we already have an updated one on hand. (Kara updated all of the tags that were previously on the tower, and there is now a "backup" bin full of tags -- what's on the tower are folks in our current directory ... rest assured, we haven't forgotten the many folks who make St. A's such a wonderful, welcoming space and want to have tags available for anyone who may only be able to make a service in-person on occasion.)

As part of our welcome and when passing the peace, name tags help put names with faces - a crucial part of fellowship! If you're new or we missed creating a new name tag for you, please contact the office and we will be happy to make you a name tag for future use.

DISABLED STREET PARKING ACCESS

Please note that the street parking along SW Sunset is reserved for picking up and dropping off those who need extra assistance getting inside for worship on Sundays. We ask that you please leave these spaces open and not park there. There is plentiful parking in our lot across Dosch. Those needing assistance can also use the driveway on Dosch for dropping off and picking up, and take the elevator up to the main level. NATIONAL SUICIDE & CRISIS LIFELINE

People experiencing a mental health crisis have a way to reach out for help in the U.S., by calling or texting the numbers 9-8-8. The 988 Suicide & Crisis Lifeline is a national network of local crisis centers that provides free and confidential emotional support to people in suicidal crisis or emotional distress 24 hours a day, 7 days a week in the United States.
